#### Who is Geoff Wiltshire!

Born 1946:

Went to Perth Modern School;

Graduated from Curtin University with a Master's Degree in Public Administration;

Geoff comes from a State Public Service background;

Working for the Premiers Department;

Chief of Staff to two Deputy Premiers;

Admin Officer for the Royal Commission into WA Inc.;

Managed the Constitution Centre for WA;

Rotarian for over 20 years and was President of Southern Districts Rotary Club 2010/11;

Chairman of Citizen Advocacy – South Metro, which is a provider of assistance to people with Disabilities;

After having completed his term as President of the Southern District Rotary Club in 2011, Geoff saw a need in this area for some type of facility to provide activities for men;

He had some knowledge of men's sheds as his brother had been a member of the Kalamunda Shed; Geoff set up a steering committee to examine the feasibility of such a place in Thornlie / Gosnells; Geoff spent many hours communicating with any organisation that he thought maybe able to help; He and his Steering Committee travelled hundreds of kilometres visiting existing Sheds to determine what we needed to do;

After the success of a public interest meeting Geoff applied for Incorporation of the Gosnells Community Men's Shed in 2012;

They say timing is everything in business, after fruitless enquiries with Commonwealth Departments, State Departments and Local Government Geoff happened to be at a (Rotary) meeting with David Fenwick, CEO of Amaroo. David offered the very derelict, Lewis House and surrounding land to the Men's Shed for their use. Geoff grabbed the offer and set about organising many busy bees to clear the land and repair the house to what we see today;

While this was happening Geoff (Million dollar man) was busily applying for grants from anyone he could think of, such as Lottery West, DVA, Rotary, Gosnells Council;

As the word got around about the good facilities we had, membership increased and we ran out of space for our activities, so Geoff who is a pretty good scrounger heard about a condemned school classroom which was scheduled for demolition. Geoff believed we could do something with this building, so he convinced the Committee to agree to buy the building. Several of us thought he had lost his marbles, but we agreed to trust his judgement and purchased the building, which after much hard work has turned out to be a valuable addition to our assets;

During this period Geoff experienced two major health events, but he was soon back in the thick of things;

A large number of the activities outside the workshop have been initiated by Geoff;

Geoff has been honoured with a Life Membership, presented to him by Premier Colin Barnett at the opening of the workshop and the annex has been named the Wiltshire Room in his honour.

ED: This is a copy of the address given by past Chairman Ray Smith at the end of month BBQ on 29<sup>th</sup> September 2023, when Geoff and his wife Loraine were presented with tokens of our appreciation for the efforts both have put in establishing this facility.



#### **Local Government Elections (Here again)**

The City of Gosnells is currently represented by 12 elected members, referred to as Councillors. The term of office for a Councillor is four years. Every two years six of the 12 Councillor positions are declared vacant, and an election is held. The next election is scheduled to take place on **21 October 2023**.

This year, for the first time, the City's Mayor will also be elected by public vote.

The City holds postal elections, which are conducted on the City's behalf by the Western Australian Electoral Commission. If you have not yet returned your ballot papers you may hand deliver them to the City of Gossnells before 21st October!

Local Government Elections are not compulsory, however my advice to you is if you cannot be bothered to vote then do not whinge about the Councillors / Mayor we finish up with!

**Twenty two** persons have nominated for the **six councillor** positions and there are **two** nominations for the **Mayor** position. Do your research and vote wisely!

# Recipe Easy Curried Devilled Eggs



#### **Ingredients**

6 hard boiled eggs; 2 tablespoons mayonnaise preferable homemade mayo, or to taste; ½ to ;¾ teaspoon curry powder - hot or mild; salt to taste optional, depending on type of curry powder. paprika for garnish:

#### **Instructions**

- 1. Slice the boiled eggs in half, scoop the yolks into a small bowl and set whites on a plate.
- 2. Add mayonnaise and curry powder to the yolks (start with the smaller amount of curry and increase according to your taste) and mash together well. Add more mayo, if needed and taste to decide if it needs salt.
- 3. Fill egg halves with mixture (I like to fill a small baggie, cut a corner and pipe the filling into the holes it's easier and a lot less messy than the spoon-and-finger method).
- 4. Sprinkle with paprika and serve.

**Variation:** This also makes the most delicious **curried egg salad sandwiches** - just mash whites and yolks together with the mayo and curry!

#### MAJOR CHANGES TO TRAIN SERVICES;

This will impact on all of us even though we may not use public transport!

The **Armadale/Thornlie Line** will <u>close from Monday</u>, <u>20 November 2023 until mid-2025</u> as part of METRONET's <u>Victoria Park - Canning Level Crossing Removal</u>, <u>Byford Rail Extension</u> and <u>Thornlie-Cockburn Link</u> projects. During this time there will also be rail revitalisation works happening between Kenwick and Sherwood.

During the shutdown, there will be **no train services** between **Armadale/Thornlie and Victoria Park**. Trains will continue to operate between Victoria Park and Perth stations, with seven new and five enhanced bus routes introduced to the bus network to support existing timetabled services.

Passengers are encouraged to plan ahead as travel times will increase during the shutdown.

Armadale and Thornlie Line Shutdown (transperth.wa.gov.au)

From 20 November services on the Armadale/Thornlie Line will operate as follows:

Full Line Closure - Monday 20 to Wednesday 22 November.

The shutdown will commence with a three-day full line closure to undertake the infrastructure works required for passenger trains to turn at Victoria Park. During this time train replacement services will operate between Victoria Park and Perth, as well as the new and enhanced bus services that are being introduced.

Part Line Closure – Thursday 23 November until mid-2025

From first service on Thursday 23 November, services will operate as follows:



- Train services will be cancelled between Armadale/Thornlie and Victoria Park stations
- Train services will operate between Victoria Park and Perth stations
- Existing bus services will be supported by seven new and five enhanced routes
- There will be changes to Optus Stadium special event services.
