VACCINATIONS:

A new version of the Shingles Vaccination is now available. You may be eligible for the 'new' vaccination if it is more than 5 years since any previous shingles vaccination.

The new version is a two shot treatment. The second shot is given three months after the first.

If you are interested in taking up the 'new' shingles vaccination just speak to your doctor.

The Shingrix® vaccine is free under the National Immunisation Program (external site) for eligible people. A 2-dose course of Shingrix® will be available for:

- Aboriginal people aged 50 years or over; and
- people aged 65 years and over:

While the Shingrix® vaccine is free, your immunisation provider may charge a consultation fee for the visit.

What an accomplished man Fred was, he was driven by his desire to succeed and without any University qualifications (which at that time his parents could Ill afford) he achieved the pinnacle of being a very successful project manager for a worldwide Construction company that is now Multiplex.




Workshop Managers Report

Computer and Technology Group:

Shutdown of the 3G Phone network

If your phone is 3G only or 4G without VoLTE compatibility when the networks shutdown you will not be able to **dial 000**. This will happen as follows: Telstra 31 August 2024, Optus September 2024. So you need to check your phone. Most phone will show **VoLTE** next to the battery symbol which will confirm you are most likely will have a 4G VoLTE compatible phone. Telstra recommends that you still check!

How to check:

Telstra customers: To find out if your mobile phone is impacted **SMS 3 to 3498** and Telstra will then send you a message confirming your status.

Optus and other providers: Call your provider and find out your status.

All iPhone Users

Apples warning about Mercenary Spyware Attacks

If you have received the following email or iMessage from Apple, please take this seriously.

"Apple detected that you are being targeted by a mercenary spyware attack that is trying to remotely compromise the iPhone associated with your Apple ID -xxx-,

"This attack is likely targeting you specifically because of who you are or what you do. Although it's never possible to achieve absolute certainty when detecting such attacks, Apple has high confidence in this warning — please take it seriously.

"We are unable to provide more information about what caused us to send you this notification, as that may help mercenary spyware attackers adapt their behaviour to evade detection in the future.

"Mercenary spyware attacks, such as those using Pegasus from the NSO Group, are exceptionally rare and vastly more sophisticated than regular cybercriminal activity or consumer malware."

Apple offers the following advice to all users to help protect themselves against all types of malware:

- Update devices to the latest software, as that includes the latest security fixes.
- Protect devices with a passcode.
- Use two-factor authentication and a strong password for Apple ID.
- Install apps from the App Store.
- Use strong and unique passwords online.
- Don't click on links or attachments from unknown senders.

This is not a spam message please follow the above recommendations.

 - * Less choices of where you purchase based on affordability.


What a cashless society does guarantee:


- * Banks have full control of every single cent you own.




