Annual Fees:

This was communicated to members by an email on 1stJune 2024(edited.):

Your management committee has considered the following matters when reviewing the fees:-

- 1. Membership fees should keep up with inflation each year rather than large jumps every 2-3 years. The Perth CPI for the last 12 months being 3.4%
- 2. The fees should cover the base cost of running the organisation. Based on a number of different scenarios, this is being achieved, if income includes all monies being directly paid by members.
- 3. Being cognisant of the fees being charged by similar organisations within our area.

The committee concluded that there will not be an increase in fees for 2024/25 and will remain at \$95.Information regarding payment of Membership fees will be advised to members in late June. Payments will be accepted from the 1st of July.

Spending quite a while watching two massive 200 Tonne Cranes lifting a pre cast concrete bridge section into place, on the new Armadale to Byford railway extension. 

Recipe Cheap and Easy Spinach and Ricotta Pasta



Easy; 0:10 Prep; 0:15 Cook; 4 Servings:

Ingredients

250g fettuccine uncooked; 2 tbsp olive oil; 2 cloves garlic crushed;

1/2 cup milk; 300g full fat ricotta; 125g frozen chopped spinach thawed and

drained; 1 x pinch of salt and pepper:

Method

- 1. Bring a large saucepan of water to the boil, and cook the pasta as per the packet instructions or until al dente.
- 2. In a large (deep) frying pan over medium heat, add the garlic and olive oil. Cook for 2 minutes, until golden. Add in the ricotta and milk until it forms a sauce. Add in 1/2 cup of water from the pasta pot if you want to smooth it out more. Turn the heat to low, and let simmer.
- 3. Drain the pasta once cooked, and add to the frying pan with the ricotta sauce. Squeeze any excess liquid from the spinach, and then add to the frying pan. Stir to combine and coat the pasta.
- 4. Serve immediately.
