#### Safety and Risk Management Committee

The Safety and Risk Management sub-committee is no longer meeting. Safety and Risk Management will be dealt with by the Management Committee. Latest defibrillator has been received and will be installed soon. Along with the defibrillator we have received access to an online course for ten members. Ted and Scott will test the course. There is a probability that other members rather than current first aid officers will do the online course.

The right hand stop button on the small table saw has limited access and requires looking at. Dust extraction is also not working from this machine. Regular cleaning is required.

The large panel saw machine has an issue when cutting large sheets (e.g. 2.4mx1.2m) where access to stop button is blocked. Look at a pendant stop/start button to be considered.

It was mentioned that all workshop machines require regular cleaning. The current machinery dust extraction system is not working effectively.

ALASKAN & CANADA ADVENTURE.

Well it was a long and tiring journey to get to Vancouver and then find our accommodation. Although Vancouver is a lovely city there is a lot of homelessness there, it is a pitiful sight in such a nice surroundings. Anyway we hired electric bikes and toured all over the city, especially Stanley Park and Grenville Island. Then it was off on a cruise through the inside passage stopping at the Ports of Juneau, Skagway, Ketchikan and Sitka, all pretty good in their own way. Took a day tour over the Rockies into Canada, impressive, great scenery. On the return cruise stopped at the same ports.

# Recipe Prune and Orange Cookies.

Prep time – 20 mins; cooking – 15 min

**Ingredients** 

90g Butter; ½ cup Icing (powdered) sugar; Zest of 1 orange;

½ cup plain flour; ¾ cup pitted prunes, chopped; 50g dark chocolate:


#### Method:

1. Preheat oven to 180°C. Lightly butter an oven tray;

- 2. Cream together the butter, sugar and orange zest, then blend in the flour. Stir the prunes through the mixture;
- 3. Roll the mixture into small balls and place on the tray. Flatten with a fork, then bake for 12 15 minutes;
- 4. Cool on the tray for 5 minutes before removing to a wire rack to cool completely;
- 5. Melt the chocolate in a bowl over a saucepan of simmering water. Decorate the cookies with the melted chocolate.




