
Darts are open to everyone who wishes to partake as a single or team player. Come along and have a bit of fun.






This gardening sure is hard work!

Recipe Corner

Hands up anyone has an air fryer (a miniature glorified fan forced oven).

Me, I have one. Bought it on a whim & thus it sits mainly unused on the kitchen bench, as it's to big to fit in the under bench cupboards.

Still, many users rave over them & produce spectacular meals.

My crowning glory was crispy (black) cauliflower florettes, which were surprisingly crunchy & very tasty, but I have eclectic/strange tastes.

Some suggestions for those who have to cook for themselves.

- Air-Fryer Chicken Thighs are easy to prepare with a seasoning of paprika and garlic, offering a flavourful and juicy result.
- Air-Fryer Salmon is a quick, healthy option seasoned simply with garlic powder, pepper, and paprika for a light, flaky dish.
- Air-Fryer Sweet Potato Fries provide bold flavours with garlic and paprika seasoning, offering a crispy and tender side dish.
- Air-Fryer Red Potatoes, seasoned with rosemary or Cajun spice, are a fragrant and easyto-prepare side with minimal oil.
- Air-Fryer Pickles provide a delightful crunch with a panko breadcrumb coating, making them a perfect snack with minimal oil.
